Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment

Perth and Kinross is now recycling 55% of all household waste at the kerbside and by using Recycling Centres and Points. This is a fantastic achievement, however, there is still more to do. The Scottish Government has set challenging future recycling targets which will require us to recycle 60% of all household waste by 2020, and 70% by 2025. There will also be future bans to landfill of biodegradable and other recyclable materials.

Over a lifetime, the average Scot will create 3.3 tonnes of waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE). What this means is that we need to recycle more materials more often, and to help achieve this we are asking households to recycle all unwanted or damaged electrical and electronic equipment at local Recycling Centres.

Your local Household Recycling Centre accepts a wide range of waste electrical and electronic equipment including:

Audio-visual equipment

- *Cameras*
- *Radios*
- *Stereo systems and speakers*
- *Video and DVD players*
- *Record players*
- *MP3 players*

Electrical and electronic tools

- *Power tools*
- *Lawnmowers, trimmers and hedge trimmers*
- *Leaf blowers*

Household batteries

- *Button, AAA, AA, C, D, 6V, 9V*

Large appliances and white goods

- *Cookers and microwaves*
- *Washing machines*

Light bulbs

- *Fluorescent tubes*

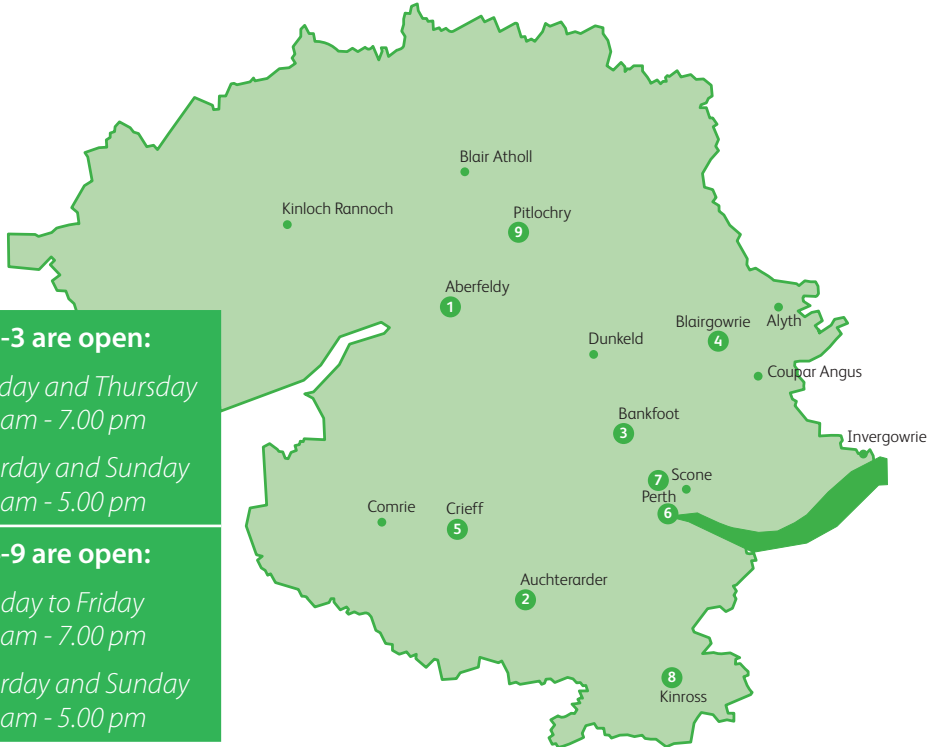

Recycling Journey for WEEE

All waste electrical and electronic equipment is sorted and treated for recycling within the Perth area where it is broken down into various material streams. These can include precious metals, a variety of plastic types, glass, aluminium and steel. After the materials are sorted they are sent on to the recycling market to be remanufactured into new products. Recycling waste electrical and electronic equipment diverts these materials away from landfill, causing less environmental pollution, and preserving valuable natural resources.

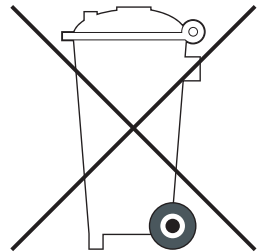

Battery Recycling

We currently throw away over 600 million batteries in the UK every year. Batteries should not be disposed of in general waste bins as they will be sent to landfill where they corrode and take up to 200 years to break down. All household batteries can be recycled at your local Household Recycling Centre.
