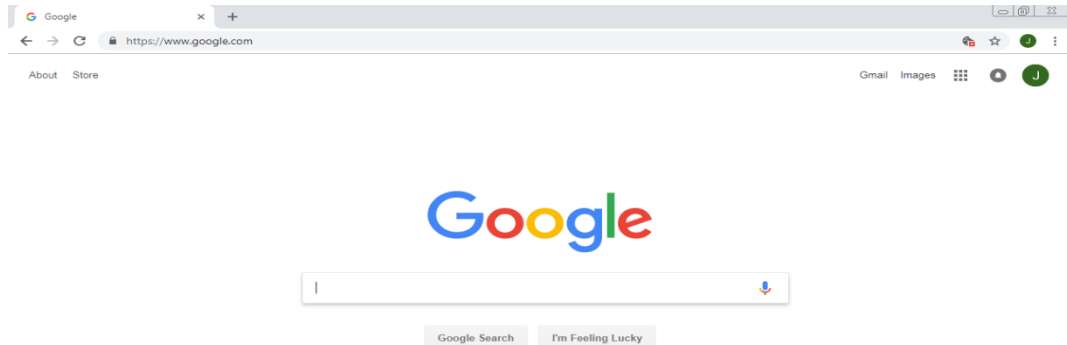

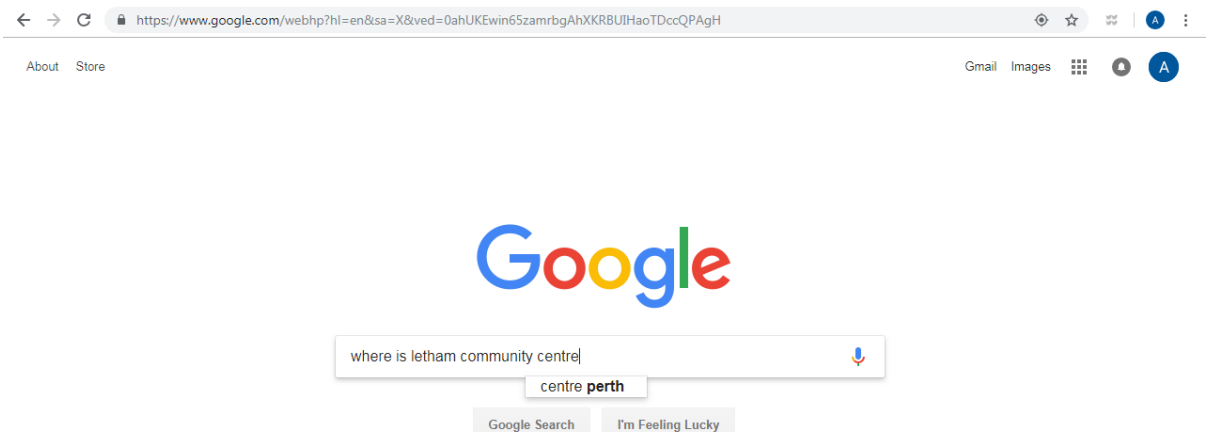


Google Search Engine

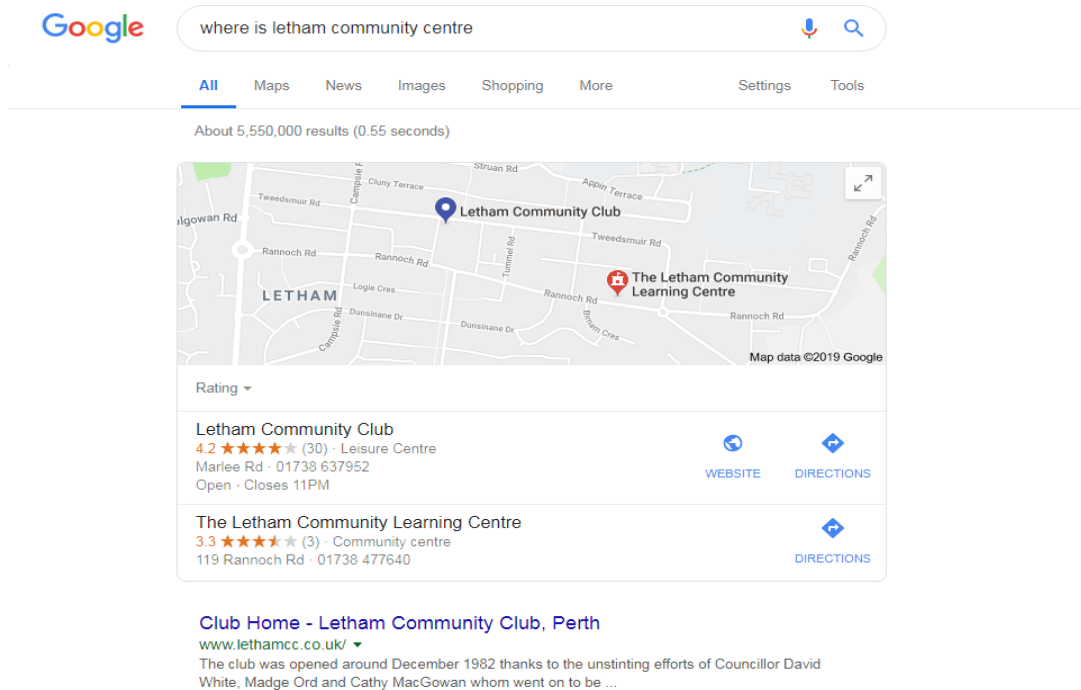
1. First thing to do before you can search any information is to open up google or google chrome. This will then come up Google's search engines. Like so;



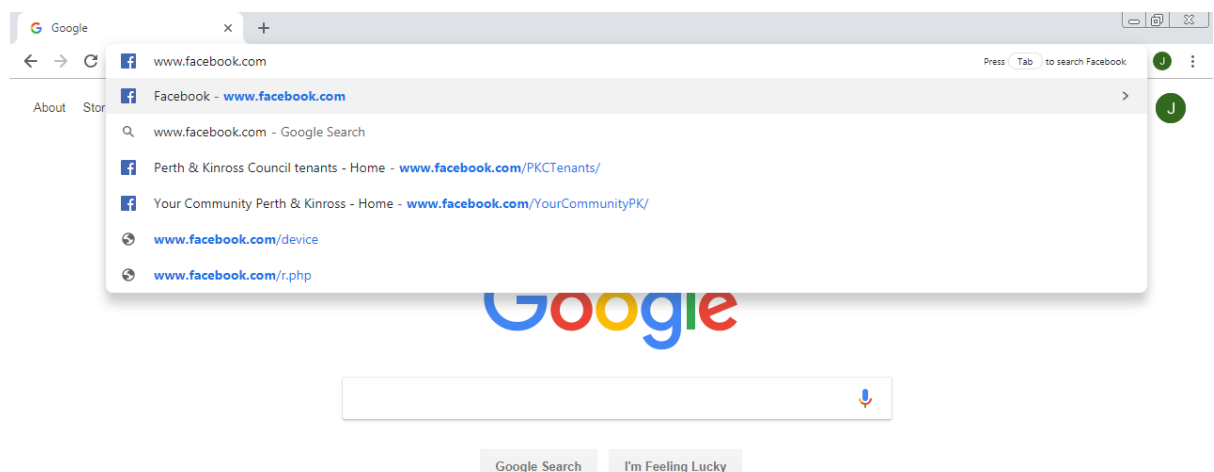
2. Now you click on the search box (which is above the buttons that say 'Google Search' and 'I'm Feeling Lucky') and type in any information you wish to find out. Whilst doing this it'll come up with suggestions of what other people have searched with Google.



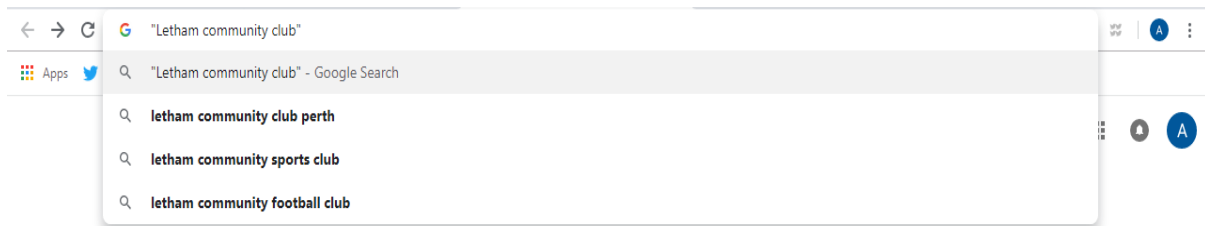
- Once you are done typing your question or information, click on 'Google Search' which will then show you the answer and/or websites that may be useful for you.



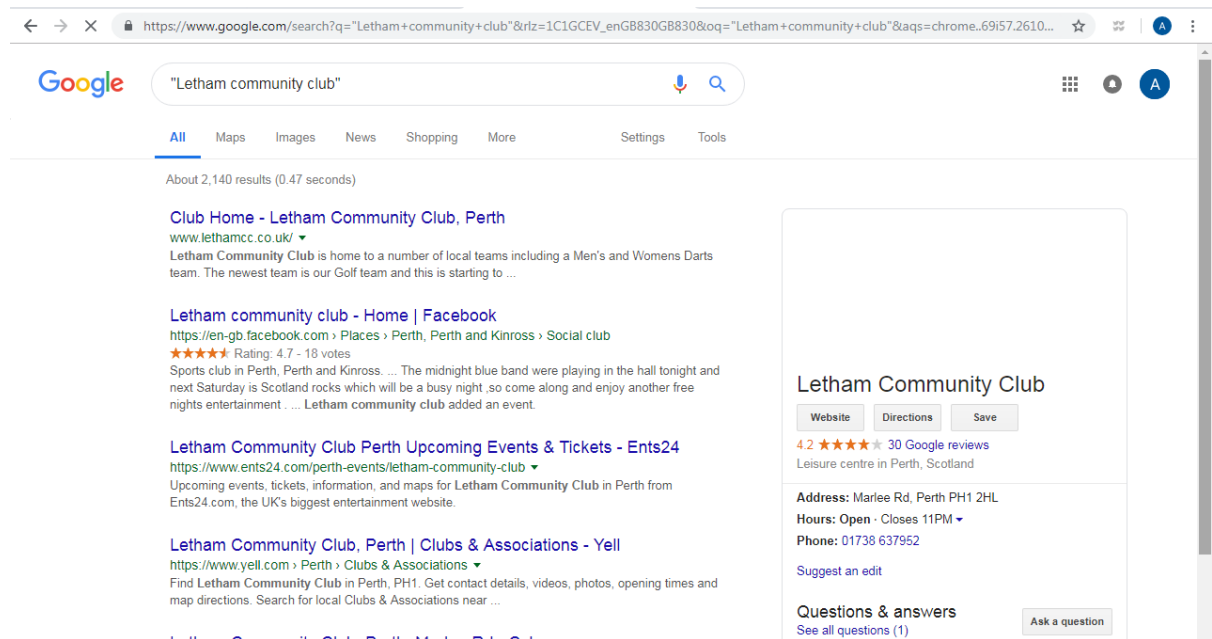
- If you were looking for a particular website you can then go onto the other search engine Google has, and type in the website you would wish to look at. Then simply press the tab button on your keyboard which will allow Google to take you straight to the website.



5. Quotation marks are a good short cut, for your Google search to take you to the information you are looking for on the internet. This is because quotation marks will make Google able to look for those specific words that are used on websites.



6. Once you Google searched the quotation marks with information you would like to know, websites that have those specific words in their information will appear. Like so:



7. A hyphen is also a good short cut to use while searching for information through Google. Especially when searching a word that can various meanings/locations. For example, if you wanted to search 'Perth events' Google will give you results for events in Perth, Scotland and Perth, Australia. However, if you use the hyphen, 'Perth events – Scotland', Google will automatically only show you events happening in Perth, Scotland.

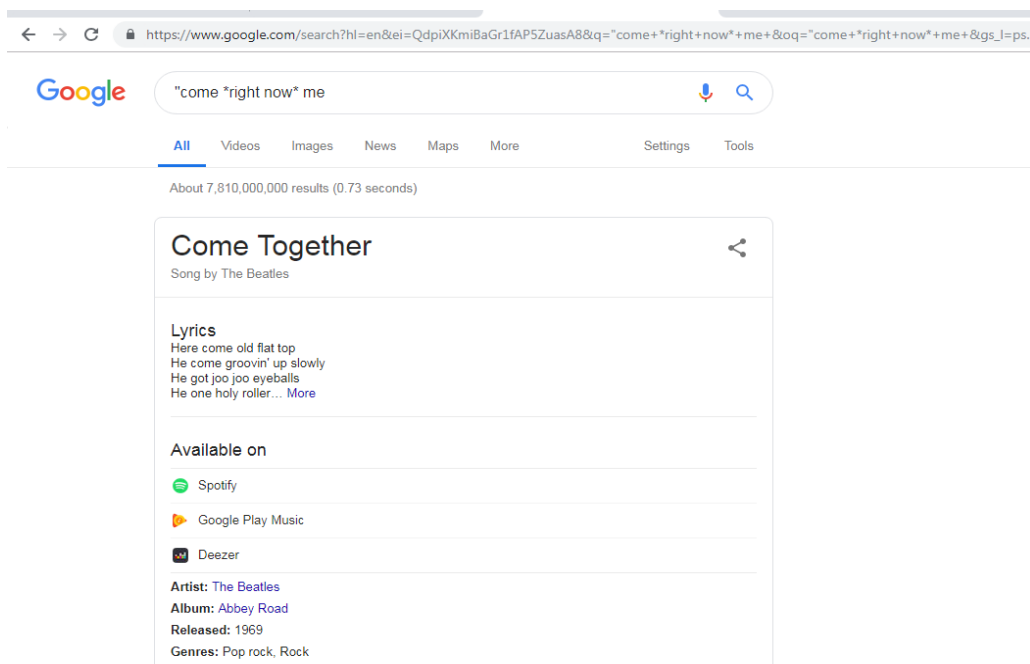

Perth
 City in Scotland

Perth is a city beside the River Tay in central Scotland. The Fergusson Gallery, in a former circular water tower, features the paintings of 20th-century Scottish Colourist John Duncan Fergusson, and works by his wife, dancer Margaret Morris. The Black Watch Museum, at the Black Watch regiment's ancestral home in Balhousie Castle, shows uniforms, medals, weapons and paintings. Nearby is Perth Museum and Art Gallery.

8. 'Asterisk Wildcard' is a very useful shortcut when it comes to Google, as this allows you to search for a phrase/song without knowing all the words. For example, "Come *right now* me" is only a couple of words of a song but Google will know the asterisks could be any word.



As Google has shown the phrase/lyrics are from the song Come Together by The Beatles.
