## PROPERTY SUB GROUP – DRAFT FOR DISCUSSION

### Background

A report containing proposals for Pitlochry High School (Secondary), as part of the School Estate Transformation Programme was considered by the Council's Lifelong Learning Committee on 4 September 2019. The decision of the committee was to proceed with a proposal to develop a Highland Perthshire Learning Partnership (HPLP).

A Steering Group has been created to agree the scope of the project and, and to oversee the development of an Action Plan, which will be presented to Lifelong Learning Committee in January 2020.

Two sub groups will take forward the two key parts of the project:

- HPLP Learning sub group, to look at the models of delivery of Senior Phase in Highland Perthshire
- HPLP Property sub group, to explore proposals to identify wider community use of Pitlochry High School with other services and partners

### Membership of the HPLP Property Sub Group

Membership of the Steering Group will include:

- Service Manager (resource management) (Chair)
- School Estate Transformation Project Officer
- Pitlochry High School Senior Management representative
- Pitlochry High School Parent Council or parent representative
- Pitlochry High School pupil representative
- Perth College UHI representative
- Community Council representative
- Property Services representative
- Tayside Regional Improvement Collaborative Project Officer (to link with the Learning group on the educational needs/requirements)
- Corporate Property Asset Management Transformation Programme Manager (to lead on community use)

#### Remit of Property Sub Group

To develop a plan for the development of the Pitlochry High School building which will where possible:

- (a) Meet the accommodation needs of Pitlochry High School (nursery, primary and secondary) in the short to medium term;
- (b) Support the aspirations of the HPLP including the delivery of courses by Perth College UHI and any new requirements for the senior phase;
- (c) Take into account potential opportunities to maximise the community use of Pitlochry High School; and
- (d) Consider the ongoing maintenance of the building.
