Thank you for attending this drop-in session. Community involvement is a key part of flood risk management, and your views are appreciated.

Next Steps

Your views are important to us and will inform the final detailed design of the flood scheme.

The Council will collect any questions and feedback provided by you and will respond in the form of a short report, summarising any comments made. This report will be published and demonstrate how your views have been considered in the final proposals.

We will issue a further newsletter once the report and final proposals are available.

The advanced works will be undertaken by Balfour Beatty and will progress from July until October 2022. The indicative timeline for the scheme is shown below.

Phase of Work	Description and Timescale
Statutory Process	Complete. The Comrie Flood Protection Scheme was confirmed on 18 August 2021. The Scottish Ministers directed that planning permission was granted on 16 December 2021.
Detailed Design	Currently on-going. This will provide the final design information to the contractor. Currently programmed for completion in late summer 2022.
Advance Works	Advance works, including public utility service diversions, tree clearance (Field of Refuge), erosion protection works (Field of Refuge) and other investigations are anticipated throughout 2022.
Tender Period	The process to engage a Contractor for the scheme will take until the end of 2022.
Construction Phase	The Contractor will inform the works programme. The main construction works are currently expected to be on site in early 2023, with a duration of 18 months.

Funding Position

The Comrie Flood Protection Scheme has been included within the national priority list of flood schemes and forms part of the current Tay Flood Risk Management Plan and Local Flood Risk Management Plan.

The Scottish Government and the Council have agreed in principle to fund the scheme. The Scottish Government will contribute 80% of the overall capital cost and the Council will contribute the remaining 20%.

Funding is in place and the current project budget is £27.9M, including allowances for contingencies.
