Actions under Priority 1 to develop an empty homes strategy and change of use for vacant properties as well as place making policies may mean existing built heritage is maintained and enhanced. Significant positive impact

Justification:

Actions under Priority 1 aim to maximise the numbers if social homes, diversify the range of property sizes and adaptable homes including a 10% wheelchair target. Braden the range of affordable homes through a range of models including intermediate housing, Low Cost Housing options, and affordable self-build.

Justification:

Under Priority 1 the strategy aims to encourage mixed brownfield developments. Along with an action to develop partnership working to ensure collaborative investment approach towards locality leadership and place planning processes.

2 Climate Change

What impact will the proposal have in tackling the causes and effects of climate change?

Minor positive impact

Justification:

PKC activities account for 3% of P & K emissions. Most emission come from heating our homes and buildings, transport, consumer goods and waste. PKC Climate Change Action Plan Priority Theme 2 feeds into the LHS and sets out measures to improve energy efficiency of existing affordable housing by targeting EPC D and below til 2025 and Band B and below beyond 2025. Review the design guide including passive house standards for new build from 2022 onwards. Engage with owner occupiers and private landlords to make then aware and access funding programmes for improved energy efficiency of homes. Develop and implement a Local Heat and Energy Efficiency Strategy. These actions aim to contribute to the overall reduction in emissions by 75% by 2029.

Minor positive impact

Justification:

Under Priority 4 Delivering quality homes with affordable warmth, zero emission and SMART technology, Will improve the energy efficiency of existing and new build housing will make homes more resilient to climate change, particularly through passive-haus new build.
