Level 2 Child Protection Training



What is the training about ?

This half day workshop aims to build on the Level 1 LearnPro eLearning module. The training is underpinned by the Children and Young People (Scotland) Act 2014 and the Scottish Governments key policy of GIRFEC. The training aims to develop the skills and knowledge required to identify and respond to child protection concerns.

Who is the training for ?

This training is aimed at new staff building their experience of child protection work and for experienced staff who require some updating and consolidation.

What level is this training, and do I need any specific skills ?

Attendance at this training should be agreed with your line manager.

Whilst some content (particularly regarding policy, guidance and practice) is aimed specifically at NHS Tayside staff, staff from other services will be asked to refer to their own agencies policy, guidance and practice.

How is this training taught ?

This training is delivered face to face and taught by experienced professionals. It offers a range of methods to help participants develop both skills and knowledge. These include direct formal input, small group discussions, exercises and case study materials.

By the end of the training course participants will be able to-

- Know their role and responsibility and are clear how to respond to a child protection concern.
- Describe the different types of child abuse that exist signs and symptoms.
- Identify what key factors can impact negatively on a child or young person's wellbeing.
- Know what tools are available to help when assessing child protection.
- Know the importance of sharing information and are clear on what and where you record child protection concerns.
- Explain possible outcomes of a child protection concern.
