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#### **Summer Guidance on Ticks**

Lyme disease is still on the rise in Scotland. It is caused by being bitten by an infected tick and can be serious if not treated. To avoid tick bites when spending time outdoors, stick to footpaths where possible, cover up bare skin with trousers and long sleeves, and use insect repellent on exposed skin. If you or a child is bitten, remove the tick as soon as possible. More information here. The quicker you find and remove ticks, the less likely you are to get ill.

# **Block Play Inservice Day Offer**

As part of the in service day offer planned for 12 and 13 August, there will be the opportunity for all ELC settings to book a space for one practitioner from their setting to attend a half day of block play training. This practical, in-person training will be led by Daniel Spry, an early years expert who works closely with Community Playthings to promote the pedagogical benefits of block play, understanding the seven stages of block play and how these can support learning across the curriculum.

# **PDA Education Support Assistance (Level 6)**

This course runs one evening per week at the Perth UHI college and aims to provide a qualification for those who are currently employed as an Education Support Assistant or those who would like to take on that role. It will enable you to develop the specific skills of an Education Support Assistant and to develop knowledge of issues associated with children and young people in educational settings. It also provides you with a deeper knowledge of Additional Support Needs across a broad spectrum of specific needs and disabilities. The course includes a work experience element which can be completed either in your workplace if you are currently employed in an educational setting or through volunteer work in a similar role. This qualification meets the Scottish Social Services Council (SSSC) requirements for a Support Worker in a Day Care of Children Service.

## PDA Trauma Informed Approaches (Level 7)

This is an online course that can be studies at a time that suits you but we recommend allowing 4 hours per week to complete the learning. This PDA Trauma Informed Approaches (SCQF level 7) allows you to gain knowledge and understanding of trauma, including the causes and impact of trauma on an individual. You will also learn the importance of

being an informed practitioner, enabling you to support individuals affected by trauma.

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# Digital Improvement Programme 2023-2024

A training opportunity was offered to support ELC settings who had digital literacy as a focus for improvement. The programme involved looking at improvement methodology and how this can be applied to develop digital literacy in ELC settings.

The programme consisted of three sessions. After each session there was an expectation that the practitioners would set a goal/aim and work with the team to achieve this. Each session allowed for feedback and discussion on the tasks set to allow for sharing of practice and collaborative working with other practitioners in ELC who are developing digital literacy in their ELC setting.

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**Incredible Years** 



The closing date for applications for our Incredible Years Groups starting in Aug will be the 15th July and for the group starting on October it will be 13th Sep.

We will have our Incredible Years Baby, Toddler, Basic and School age groups running from Aug-Feb . Groups will run in both central and rural areas throughout Perth and Kinross based on demand. These courses will focus on bringing parents/carers together to share ideas and support positive outcomes with the following:

#### Baby IY ages 0-11 months

- · Supports Parents/carers.
- · Help their babies feel loved, safe and secure
- Helps develop bond with baby
- Encourages physical and language development in their baby.

#### IY Toddler Programme ages 1-3

- Support parents/carer
- To help toddler feel loved and secure / strategies to manage separation and reunion.

- Encourage language, social and emotional development.
- Establish clear and predictable routines.

IY basic programme ages 3-6 & School age ages 7 -12

- Support parents/carer
- Building their child's language, academic, emotional, and social skills to help them become ready for school
- Building relationships between parents/carers and children
- Supporting their child to develop independent behaviours, routines, such as mealtimes, bedtimes, getting dressed and following house rules
- Managing behaviours such as tantrums, defiance, and aggression.

# **Dads Survey 2024 - Share Your Voice**



The valuable views of dads are often ignored. However, each June we reach out to dads from all across Scotland to hear their unique experiences of fatherhood. Their collective voice helps us create an authentic snapshot of Scottish fatherhood, capturing how dads have felt over the last year and what matters to them most.

Last year, our survey received it's largest ever response with over 1,000 dads sharing their voices. This helped us better understand that:

- There's a growing childcare revolution with more and more dads spending time with their children.
- The number of dads experiencing very poor mental health had almost doubled between surveys and most were not aware of the support available.
- In the wake of the COVID lockdowns, dads are continuing to choose family-friendly flexible working in order to spend more time with their children.

As has been learned from across each annual survey - a lot can change in a year. How is the cost of living crisis and the pressures on services affecting families in Scotland? How are dads feeling? And has the childcare revolution continued to thrive?
