

Your Right to Appeal

The Council will send you formal notification of our decision on your homeless application by letter. If you think that the decision we have made is wrong, or if we have offered you accommodation which you feel doesn't meet the needs of you and your household, you have a right to ask us to undertake a review of that decision.

Under the terms of the Housing (Scotland) Act 1987 the Council has a legal duty to review our decision if you ask us to.

How can I ask for a review?

You have 21 days from the date of your decision letter (or offer of accommodation) to ask us for a review. You can ask for a review using this form. You can submit this form electronically by clicking on the 'submit by Email' button at the top of this page, or print the form and submit it hard copy to the Homeless Operations Manager, Housing Advice Centre, 10-16 York Place, PERTH PH2 8EP.
